In keeping with the sacrificial and thanksgiving nature of the season, Church Council has decided that a retiring offering will be held each service. The proceeds will support Mr Michael Hauser in his work in the PNG's Lutheran Seminary in Lae. Michael was placed by the LCA into this position last August with the agreement of the ELCPNG.

He serves in this important mission field by teaching PNG's future Lutheran pastors in the areas of systematic theology and historical studies. What's Lent all about?

If you missed Ash Wednesday's service, you might find the following information useful from that service order. Please speak to Pastor Matt if you want to know more.

The name Lent probably derived from the Anglo-Saxon word meaning spring, the time when the days lengthen. The early Christians remembered with special devotions the forty hours during which our Saviour lay in the tomb. The period of commemoration was later extended to two weeks..., and eventually, in recognition of the forty days of our Lord's temptation, to forty days. Since Sundays were never fast days, being in Lent but not of Lent, four weekdays were added to the six weeks and this ... finally fixed the season as forty fasting days...

The medieval observance of Lent with its rigours and efforts at appeasement was a tragic relapse from the joy of early Christians in completed redemption to the fear and uncertainty of pre-Christian thought. Much of this is felt in the propers [prayers and readings] of the Sundays. Some of these seem to have been chosen in line with the medieval conception of fasting, penitence, and good works in the spirit of work-righteousness and the hope of acquiring "merit" before God.

However, even with the medieval atmosphere still pervading it, the season of Lent has demonstrated positive values for the post-Reformation church... [But] Whether we fully realize it or not, the church has made a major shift in emphasis from the sense of joy and triumph felt by the early Christians in the long celebration of Eastertide to the sombre contemplation of Christ's sufferings and death and the subjective stress upon personal penitence and self-discipline which pervade the lengthy observance of Lententide. In this, as in other matters, we might well discard the garments of mourning and put on again the robes of victory worn by the pre-Roman church.

[Hence] The Lutheran observance of Lent is commemorative and emulative as well as penitential. It regards the season as a time of special spiritual opportunity to contemplate the Passion of Christ as an incentive for self-examination, repentance, and growth in faith and grace.
