

Reformation Day is usually commemorated on 31 October, or the closest Sunday to that. We commemorate it today because on 30 October we celebrated 50 years of the LCA. We could have let Reformation Commemoration 'go'... but we are now in a countdown over the next year to the 500th anniversary since Luther posted his disputation in 1517 ... a day long since

recognised as changing much about the western world at that time and since. Some bad - schisms are painful. But also liberating for many who have come to understand the promises of scripture in a much clearer way than existed in the medieval church. You won't hear those promises too much clearer than this one from our Epistle text today:

"For we maintain that a person is justified (declared right with God) by faith apart from observing the law" (Romans 3:28 - my edit). We don't idolise Luther. But we can thank God for his work and that of the Lutheran reformers. And we pray that the Holy Spirit will too teach us through his Word of God's saving activity through 'the redemption that came by Christ Jesus' (Romans 3:24).

National Church Life Survey: We conduct the survey **TODAY** between Divine Service and the Longest Lutheran Lunch. Clear directions will be provided. We thank Mrs Lucinda Ridgway in helping Bethlehem conduct a successful survey. We look forward to assessing and learning from the results.

Longest Lutheran Lunch: This year our Gospel readings have used Luke's Gospel. One of the big themes in Luke is that of meal fellowship. Everywhere Jesus is in meal fellowship with sinners. No one is too bad to be invited to his table, as our children found out last week in Sunday School when they looked at the story of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10). All this table fellowship in Luke, culminates in the Lord's Supper and the great eternal feast that Jesus death and resurrection has inaugurated. And so as we sit down today we do so in the joy of God's fellowship with us, and his gifts to us of each other and great abundance. It's just a tiny little reminder of something very big and grand to come...

Thank you to Mrs Carol Schmeiss for developing 'Reformation Play' for our children's address today. After the service you are welcome to take a postcard of 'Luther's Seal' which will be placed on the font - the explanation on the back makes a great point of reflection to pray through!

JOINT DECLARATION

On Reformation Day 1999, the Lutheran World Federation and the Roman Catholic Church signed a 'Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification', known now as the 'Augsburg Accord' (it was signed in the city of Augsburg). This was the first time since the Reformation that the Roman Catholic Church signed such a document of doctrinal agreement with any other church. In this document, the mutual condemna-

tions of the 16th Century with regard to the doctrine of justification were rescinded (in so far as the doctrine is outlined in this document). The Lutheran Church of Australia, through its Pastors Conferences, assented to this agreement, and also signed a similar document locally between the LCA and the Australian Catholic Church.

'Holy Communion is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ given with bread and wine, instituted by Christ himself for us Christians to eat and drink.'

Come to this sacrament:

- as a sinner who wants God's forgiveness;
- as a baptised believer who trusts that Jesus died for the forgiveness of sin;
- as a guest who humbly accepts what Jesus gives his true body and blood with the bread and wine;
- as a witness who gladly joins in this public confession of the death of Christ. Should you not wish to receive Holy Communion, you may remain in your pew or come to the altar to receive a blessing - crossing your arms to signify your intention.
